### Plains Game Hunt in South Africa for Two Hunters

#### **Sandymount Game Reserve**

This private game reserve is characterized by varied topography which includes rocky outcrops, high ridges and plateaus, densely vegetated ravines, thickets and grass covered plains.

Accommodation at the lodge includes, complimentary Wi-Fi, laundry service, gourmet meals.

Hunt can be scheduled in 2026 or 2027 with season ending November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2027

#### **Included**

- Accommodations for 6 days and 5 nights
- Trophy fees for 6 animals, 1-Warthog, 1-Common Blesbuck, 2-Common Springbucks, 1-Zebra, 1-Black or Blue Wildebeest (trophies shared between 2 hunters)
- Two professional hunters (guides) hunting vehicles, trackers, skinners and camp staff
- Field preparation of trophies includes skinning, salt, tag and delivery to local taxidermist.

#### **Not Included (in US Dollars)**

- Hunting Licenses \$60 per hunter
- Flights and accommodation before and after safari
- \$500.00 transfer fee to and from Bloemfontein or Kimberley Airport (max 4 people)
- 15% Value Added Government Tax ( $\$13,450 \times 15\% = \$2,017$ )
- Alcohol at cost plus 10%
- Taxidermy not included, nor is shipping to Canada
- Tips for hunting staff and lodge staff- your discretion

Note: Rifles are available for hire @ \$50/day per rifle, ammo at cost. If bringing your own rifle an import permit must be obtained upon arrival in Johannesburg: The permit is N/C if you do it yourself or \$150 for a pre-approved import permit. Firearm clearance at Kimberley Airport is \$35 per firearm each way.

#### **Add Ons**

- Additional Hunters \$650 per day, non-hunters \$275 per day
- Additional animals at 2026/2027 price list
- Additional hunting days, photo safaris or side trips can be arranged

While Jannie Otto Safaris caters to a diverse range of experiences, including family safaris, cultural immersion, dangerous game safaris, and photographic safaris, the donation for the Sandymount Plains Game Safari is intended for 2 hunters or at least 1 hunter and a companion to be economically viable for the donor.

Jannie Otto Safaris contributes to South Africa in several meaningful ways, primarily through conservation funding, habitat management, employment, and rural economic development.

Revenue from safaris supports habitat preservation on large private reserves such as Sandymount Park (110,000 acres). Controlled harvests maintain balanced wildlife populations, preventing overgrazing and supporting biodiversity. Funds are reinvested into anti-poaching, water points, and habitat restoration.

Large properties like Sandymount Park are maintained as wildlife habitat because hunting makes wildlife economically valuable. Without this incentive, many South African landowners would convert land to cattle ranching, crops, and build fencing that fragments habitat. Safari income keeps these landscapes wild.

Safari guests bring foreign currency into South Africa which strengthens the tourism sector, supports airlines, hotels, and local businesses, and helps stabilize rural tourism economies after downturns. Rural economies benefit through employment of professional hunters (guides), ranch staff, lodge workers, and local suppliers. There are also benefits from guest spending in rural communities.

By South Africa's law, harvested game meat may not be exported by foreign hunters and must be fully utilized, distributed ethically and used to support local communities. The "Sandymount Meat Program" is a community outreach initiative and conservation-driven meat distribution system, operated by Jannie Otto Safaris. The program focuses on donating fresh, nutritious wild game meat to local schools. Hunters and safari staff deliver meat to a local pre-school crèche and other schools in the Fauresmith area. The program provides high-protein meals to both students and teachers. For many children, these may be the only reliable meals they receive during the day. Meat is also distributed to workers, families, and nearby villages. Beyond meat, the program uses funds generated from sustainable-use hunting to invest in school infrastructure and educational supplies.

Jannie Otto Safaris also promotes youth education & conservation exposure by running Youth Safaris which teach wildlife ecology, introduces tracking and bushcraft, and promotes conservation ethics.

With Jannie Otto Safaris, hunting is a part of a greater conservation plan that is managed and controlled. Through respect for wildlife and some 42 years of experience and subsequently developed skill, African ecology is preserved and nurtured, and all hunts ultimately give life back to the land. All inhabitants of the habitat benefit. It's a cyclical win/win and ethical process.

As with hunting here in Canada, South Africa's follows a conservation model, where regulated hunting funds wildlife management, supports species recovery, and reduces poaching pressure by giving wildlife economic value.
